


WOLF CREEK SEWER INTERCEPTOR FAQ SHEET



What is the Wolf Creek Interceptor project?

Gwinnett County Department of Water Resources (DWR) is upsizing approximately 2 miles of gravity sewer from 20-inch diameter to 36-inch diameter. The pipeline was installed in the early 1980s and runs parallel to the Chattahoochee River.

Why are we doing this project?

Gwinnett County remains one of the fastest growing counties in the state. To keep up with demand and to prevent potential overflow, DWR is upsizing many gravity sewer trunk lines that were installed in the 1970s and 1980s, including the Wolf Creek Interceptor.

How long will the project last?

DWR expects to complete the easement acquisition phase in 4th quarter 2022 with construction following thereafter. Construction is estimated to last between 18-24 months

What is the construction access to this project?

The access points for this project will be through the two Gwinnett County parks on either side of the project, Simpsonwood Park on the south end and Jones Bridge Park on the north end.



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
