Self-Driving Shuttle Debuts in Peachtree Corners *First Georgia city to test driverless vehicle on public street*

PEACHTREE CORNERS, GA., Oct 4, 2019 – Olli, a 3D printed, self-driving shuttle developed by Local Motors, made its debut Tuesday in the city of Peachtree Corners at Technology Park Atlanta, a 500-acre existing technology park that is home to over 7,000 employees. As part of a three-month pilot project, the Olli shuttle is available for use by the general public.

The Peachtree Corners location is the first in the nation where the electrically powered Olli shuttle will be tested in this level of real-world conditions as it operates alongside the motoring public on a 1.5-mile public street.

“We are delighted to be able to showcase Local Motors’ driverless shuttles and to bring this new technology to Peachtree Corners,” said Mayor Mike Mason. “It’s a great opportunity for our city to look beyond traditional transportation and seek innovative ways to improve mobility and make journeys better and accessible to all. We invite our citizens and the business community to see and experience this exciting technology.”

While Olli operates over the coming months, data will be gathered via rider surveys to understand the public’s sentiment regarding self-driving shuttles, the potential for congestion relief, better mobility, and the reduction of single occupant vehicle use.

“Local Motors’ decision to deploy Olli shuttles along the Curiosity Lab test track confirms how significant the city’s living laboratory has already become as a step in the evolution of advancing intelligent mobility,” said Peachtree Corners’ city manager, Brian Johnson. “With Curiosity Lab here at our doorstep, our city is well positioned to be a leader in the growth of intelligent mobility research.”

Two Olli shuttles will operate weekdays on the specially designed test track on Technology Parkway from Oct. 1, to Dec. 31, 2019. Those interested in riding Olli are encouraged to park at the Peachtree Corners City Hall, 310 Technology Parkway in Peachtree Corners and walk across the street to the Olli stop located on the corner of Westech Drive and Technology Parkway.

“Curiosity Lab at Peachtree Corners is a perfect location for Local Motors to demonstrate and further improve Olli’s technology,” said Nick Cole, Senior VP of Sales for Local Motors. “We are excited to offer residents, workers, and those visiting the city a driverless vehicle experience. Olli demonstrates the future of autonomous vehicle technology, and Local Motors is pleased to collaborate with Peachtree Corners to further the development of intelligent mobility technology.”
